

Comfort quilts are given to members of our guild who have lost a close family member; someone who is going through cancer or other severe medial situation; or someone who had extraordinary difficulties in their life. We are tying to keep ahead of the need, so a quilt will be ready when needed. If you would like to help with this project, make a 12 1/2" block. Use any design or color you like, sign the block and bring it to the next Guild meeting. We will have a basket available for the completed blocks. If you know of a guild member who needs a comfort quilt, please contact Jan Person, Marilyn Dreger, Ying Chi or any board member. Thank you to everyone who has donated blocks and finishing supplies in the past.

#### **DONATIONS TO THE GUILD**

During the year, Sinnissippi Quilters periodically receives donations of both money and quilting-related goods. I am the person who has volunteered to compose the official letters that the givers receive acknowledging their donations. I need your help because the Internal Revenue Service has some specific requirements and guidelines that charities such as ours need to follow.

If you are the person who receives a donation to the guild, the following is information that we need:

Donor's name

Donor's mailing address

Donor's contact information (either phone or email)

What exactly they gave (dollar amount or a fairly good description of goods)

The date of the donation

As an example of a description of goods, you might say "12 yards quilting fabric". No need to be more specific than that. Estimate quantities wherever possible.


Some people may indicate that they do not need a donation letter. That's OK – we then don't have to send one. For anyone to include the donation on their income taxes, they need to have that letter from us. With the exception of gifts of money, the responsibility for valuing their donation rests with the giver not the guild.

#### April 6 "I love quilting" Mug Rug finished size 9"x6 1/2 "

**Supply List** 

Fabric needed:

1 fat eighth for background 8" x 8" scrap for lettering

1 fat eighth for heart, 4 patches, and binding 11" x 8" piece of fabric for backing

2"x 10" scrap for 4 patches 11" x 8" piece of batting

2" x 14" scrap for star points 8" x 8" piece of paper-backed fusible webbing

Matching thread for piecing; appliqué and quilting Also needed are your sewing machine, scissors for cutting out letters, and sewing kit. Cutting instructions:

From background fabric: Cut  $1 - 6\frac{1}{2}$  "x 5" rectangle

Cut 4- 1 ½ "x 2 ½ "rectangles for flying geese units

Cut  $4 - 1\frac{1}{2}$  "squares for star corners

From the focus fabric: Cut  $2 - 2\frac{1}{2}$  " x 20" strips for binding

Cut 6 – 1 1/2 "squares for the 4 patch

From the scraps: Cut  $6 - 1 \frac{1}{2}$  squares for the 4 patch

Cut 8 - 1 ½" squares for the star points

#### May 4 In May we will be working on "Spring Fling" Table Runner, size 18"x 45"

Supple list: Sewing machine, sewing supplies, rotary cutter, ruler.

Fabric list: ½ yard for inner border and binding; ½ yard for background; ½ yard for center panel and

flowers; a fat 1/8 (9"x12") for flower centers; 1 3/8 yard for backing.

Sample will be shown at the April meetings.

#### **Guild Meeting Notes**

#### **February 2, 2017**

**Raffle Tickets**: Members were reminded to pick up their raffle tickets to sell and turn in medallions if completed. The raffle quilt will be taken to several area quilt guild meetings. Volunteers are need to take the quilt to these meetings.

**Program:** Lynn Schmitt presented a program on "A Different Kind of Crayons" using various fabrics such as wool, silk, home décor, cotton and batiks on pieced and appliquéd quilts. A workshop creating a seasonal appliqué project will be held on Saturday, February 4, 2017.

Treasurer's Report: Checking Account balance is \$1,903.70 and the money market account balance is \$10,018.08.

**Quilt Show:** It was reported that the next meeting will be on February 13, 2017. Sign-up sheets for working are available for members. Items for the boutique and the silent auction are now being accepted. Barb Clucas notified the member ship that she will need volunteers to price the boutique items in March or April. All registration forms for the quilt show are due at the April 6th meeting.

Quilt Show Challenge: Three completed quilts were shown and the membership was remained that the challenge quilts will be due by April 6th, 2017.

**Membership:** A mixer activity prior to the meeting was well received.

**Special Project:** March will be the neo-natal sew-in. Laura O'Connell was thanked for researching a new neo-natal label for the quilts. The executive board approved the purchase of 500 labels. Cecilla Mann was thanked for securing a \$250 grant from Thrivent to sponsor the neo-natal sew-in day. The money will be used to purchase batting and fabric.

Publications: Newsletter items are due by March 15th for the April/ May newsletter.

**Programs:** Two workshops will be given by Toby Lischko in July. April's meeting will be a round robin forum entitled "Finishing Your Quilt for Show and Judging".

**SPAM:** The next workshop would be February 18th and the project will be a clutch purse.

**Stocking for Soldiers:** The stockings for this year will be slightly bigger. \$1,400.00 remains from the donations received. In March, a sign-up sheet will be available for members to choose from the various activities needed throughout the year.

**Morning Workshop:** It was reported that there is no workshop in March, due to the sew-in and that members can make a mug rug at the April workshop.

**Miscellaneous:** Judy Mullen is taking orders for **American Quilters Catalog and Fons and Porter subscriptions**: Anne Brown will be heading a **Nominating Committee** and needs 2 more people to serve. Monica Kelso informed members of the **April 7th bus tip to the International Quilt Expo.** A motion was passed to get a booth at the **Madison Quilt Expo.** Members were informed of the passing of **Peggy Blair**. The guild will not sell **sweater mittens** for personal use to members. If a guild member would like to make them, Jane Erickson can help them find the info online.

#### March 2, 20017

**Quilt Show:** Next committee meeting is March 13th at Marie Tovo's home at 7:00 p.m. Members were reminded to pick up their raffle tickets to sell. The raffle quilt will be taken to several area quilt guild meetings. Items for the boutique and silent auction are due today. All registration forms for the quilt show are due by April 6th. Ad space is still available for the booklet. The raffle quilt will be on display for the next two weeks at the Cherry Valley Library. 5,000 bookmarks have been distributed. It was requested that member distribute the remaining 4,000. An e-mail blast has been sent to area quilt shops and guilds. A press release is available for members to give to any local organization's newsletter in hopes of getting the information out about the quilt show to a wider audience.

Quilt Show Challenge: The membership was reminded that the challenge quilts are due by April 6, 2017.

**Program:** The Guild held it's annual Neo Natal sew-in. Members sewed from 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. Rose Bohn thanked all participants in today's event. Approximately 35 quilts were completed. A Thank-you letter was shared from the SwedishAmerican Hospital Manager. It was announced that the Guild received a donation of \$250.00 from Thrivent Two, 90 yd. rolls of batting were accrued for the Neo Natal program with this money

Treasurer: Checking account balance is \$1,815.05 and money market account balance is \$10,018.76.

**Programs:** April's meeting will be a round robin entitled "Finishing Your Quilt for Show and Judging". It was announced that the Guild received a donation of \$250.00 from Thrivent Two, 90 yd. rolls of batting were accrued for the Neo Natal program with this money

Publications: Next deadline for newsletters items is May 15th for the June/July newsletter.

**SPAM:** The next workshop is scheduled for March 18th. The members will be finishing their neo-natal quilts. April 22nd will have a lesson on making a mug rug. Pam and Barb will not be leading SPAM will not be carry on with this program after July. Unless another member or two would like to carry on this program there is a possibility that this program may be suspended. More info to come in next months meeting.

**Stocking for Solders:** In formation was shared that the Guild received a connection for more names and addresses to send stockings to next year; which will be followed up on. Various activities, such as marking, cutting and sewing will be available for members in the coming months.

Miscellaneous: The Morning Mini-group will be working on mug rugs at the April meeting. American Quilters and Fons and Porter magazine subscriptions are being taken by Judy Mullen. The April 7th bus trip to Chicago International Quilt Expo will be leaving at 7:30 am and return at 6:30 pm. The cost is \$40.00 which included the bus fare, ticket to the expo and a bottle of water. The sweater mittens have been distributed for this year. At this time there are additional mittens which may be available for purchase at the quilt show. Correspondence was received regarding a bus trip to the Missouri Star Quilt Company by a guild in Huntley, IL. Registration forms were available for members to take. Membership was tanked for the donation of quilt blocks to Comfort Quilts. If you have any 12 1/2 inch square blocks that you would like to donate, please contact Jan Person


